Knowledge and understanding of Christianity	-Talk about a story about Jesus eg. Christmas story -Talk about the Creation and how Christians show their care for the natural world -Visit a church and recognise some items found in a church (eg. baptismal font) that are connected with important Christian beliefs or practices -Recall at least one person associated with the life of the church (eg. vicar)	-Say something about how Christians talk about their relationship with God -Talk about what stories in the Bible tell us about Jesus -Recall some of the ways in which Easter and Christmas are celebrated in different ways by different Christians	-Recall the key features of the Bible stories of Easter and Christmas -To understand that 'Gospel' means 'Good news' and identify examples of 'Good news' stories from the bible. -Understand how and why Christians try to help others -Understand key events and beliefs about Christmas and why Christmas matters to Christians	-Describe a way in which some Christians work together locally eg. charities - Recall parables and stories told by Jesus about how to live and interpret their message -Describe what Christians might learn about Jesus from the Gospel stories of his miracles and resurrection - Identify and discuss some key Christian beliefs about incarnation	-Make links between Jesus' life and teaching and different forms of Christian action, such as charitable acts -Identify some key Christian beliefs about the Creation, Fall and Salvation -Explain what the Trinity means to Christians	-Describe some of the different ways in which different Christians show their beliefs in creation, incarnation and salvation, including through the arts, worship and helping others -Describe how Christians express their beliefs about God -Explain why Jesus is referred to as the Saviour by Christians	-Give opinions about why Christians believe Jesus was the messiah, supporting them with reasons -Describe practices and events associated with Christian pilgrimages and special journeys -Debate and discuss the science and religious views about creation and understand that these views can be complementary



Knowledge and understanding of world views other than Christianity	-Talk about a story from another religion or worldview -Talk about the natural world and how care is shown to all living things -Recognise some items that are connected with important beliefs or practices -Recall at least one person associated with another world view	-Recall key features of an inspirational event, place, ritual or special occasional from a different faith or world view -Understand how stories in a selected tradition are inspirational for believers	-Recall key features of an inspirational event, place, ritual or special occasional from a different faith or world view, and provide a good reason for their view points -Understand how and why followers of other faiths and traditions help others -Recall tradition stories from other faiths and interpret their message	-Describe what believers might learn from significant texts/ writings being studied (Judaism) -Describe some special times and traditions from another religion (Judaism) eg.
